

NEWS FROM THE JPO SERVICE CENTRE

UN Coordination JPO and SARC Programmes Changes

In Resolution A/RES/72/279 of 31 May 2018, the General Assembly of the United Nations has mandated a reform of the UN development system in response to the vision of the UN Secretary-General to reposition the UN development system to deliver on the 2030 Agenda. The reform will deliver among others a reinvigorated Resident Coordinator system with an independent and empowered Resident Coordinator at its centre.

On 1 January 2019 all Resident Coordinators took over their new functions as the highest-ranking development representative of the UN system, leading 131 United Nations Country Teams (UNCTs) serving 164 countries and territories, to deliver collective responses to national needs and ensure system-wide accountability on the ground. As a result of the reform process the functions of the Resident Coordinator are separated from the those of the UNDP Resident Representative, and the Resident Coordinators will report directly to UN Secretary-General.

The above reform also has an impact on the UN Coordination JPO and Special Assistant to the Resident Coordinator (SARC) Programmes. The UNDP JPO Service Centre will continue to administer all current JPOs assigned to Resident Coordinator Offices (UNRCO) and the UN Development Coordination Office (UNDCO) and current SARCs. However, the UN Secretariat, through UNDESA, has started administered all new JPO recruitments for UNRCOs and UNDCO as of 1 January 2019, and all new SARC recruitments as of 1 February 2019.





2018 Satisfaction Survey Results




2018 JPO and SARC Donor Countries Survey




STATISTICS on Young Talent Programmes managed by the JPO Service Centre










39% of all UNDP JPOs are assigned to Headquarters locations. Africa follows with 23%.

JPO & SARC story: working towards achieving the SDGs.



Shinobu Sasaki, a current Japanese funded JPO. Shinobu currently works with UNDP at the UN Headquarter in New York as a Gender and Diversity Analyst. Here, she shares her JPO experience.

Background

I was brought up in a liberal family and taught that it is a good thing to be ambitious and to believe in possibilities Family values led me to become a feminist. After completing my doctoral studies, I obtained a job working on inclusive education for children with disabilities at an international NGO.

Motivation for becoming a JPO and SARC

When I was doing my Ph.D in Gender Studies, I had the opportunity to undertake a three-month internship with UNPD's Asia-Pacific Regional Centre in Thailand, and this experience confirmed my desire to be part of the UN mission.

I currently work as a Gender and Diversity Analyst, with a core focus on gender parity by nurturing women's leadership inside the organisation and by raising an awareness of LGBTI colleagues as well as on the inclusion of persons with disability in the workplace. UNDP strives to create an inclusive organisational culture and the agenda on diversity and inclusion is very important to us.

Additionally, I worked on the UNDP's commitment to promote the inclusion of persons with disabilities in our offices. I worked closely with JPOSC and UNV to launch and implement the Talent Programme for Young Professionals with Disabilities.

Challenging and fulfilling experience

I very much enjoy working with my colleagues from other sister agencies here. In New York, I have the opportunity to co-lead the inter-agency workshop called UN for All: Dignity and Inclusiveness at a UN workplace, working closely with UN Cares, UNFPA, UN Women, UNICEF and the Secretariat. This workshop is a full day workshop for UN personnel and their significant other and attempts to ensure our workplaces are inclusive, regardless of our gender, disability, sexual orientation, health conditions, etc. I am trained to be a facilitator and to deliver sessions every month, together with co-facilitators from other agencies. This has helped me to learn new things and constantly reminds me of why I work for the UN. Every time I facilitate, I get inspired by my colleagues who are knowledge-able, willing to share their experiences, respectful and committed to the full realisation of human rights! I really appreciate being part of this team and activity.

Advice to prospective candidates

If you want to grow as a diversity and inclusion professional, UNDP is a great place to work, so go for it! Being a JPO not only provides you with the opportunity to contribute to the work on global issues and the SDGs, but also supports your continuous learning. In my case, my current work on gender parity within the organisation pushed me to think deeper about my life-long questions on the relationship between women and men. By moving towards established, concrete steps, I am learning and improving practical and implementation skills. Above all, I believe our passion for the agenda should shape our work and careers.


























FOCUS ON THE SARC Programme



The SDP Programme is a partner funded programme implemented within the framework of the JPO Programme. It includes two roles, both at the P3 level:


• Specialist to the UNDP Country Director in the field, in areas related to results-based management and M&E, partnership and resource-mobilization, communication, or in management areas such as finance, human resources and procurement

• Specialist for the SDGs in headquarters or regional offices, in UNDP priority thematic areas related to the SDGs to support the greatest possible contribution by UNDP to the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs.



The SDP is the newest of the JPO Service Centre managed progammes. It was launched in 2017. Sweden was the first partner country to fund this Programme followed by

Denmark and Norway.

UNWTO is the latest partner agency joining the JPO Programme. The first UNWTO JPO started her assignment in October 2017 sponsored by Italy.


















